#### **Don't Panic!**

We are starting to see a lot of kennel cough, especially dogs coming in from auctions or that attend daycare. The typical sign of kennel cough is a chronic high-pitched honking cough. It can often be prompted by excitement, drinking, or gentle pressure applied to the base of the foster's neck. Your foster tugging at its leash may result in a paroxysm. Less commonly, there is also nasal or eye discharge and some dogs may suffer a slight fever or loss of appetite. The signs can last from a few days to several weeks. Cough suppressants to relieve persistent coughing can help and are available by calling the clinic. Antibiotics may be required when bacterial infections are involved. Contact us during clinic hours if you have any questions or if you think your foster may have kennel cough.

4 year old Terrier mix


